Reading activities

- ★ Promoting reading and understanding of texts taught in the classroom.
- ★ Murder Mystery: Pre-reading activity for And Then There Were None by Agatha Christie. Introduces the concept of clue-following and the murder mystery genre, as well as research and library skills.
- ★ Blackout Poetry: Using old copies of books studied in the classroom to show student understanding of the text.
- ★ Book Tasting: Promoting reading for pleasure. Different variations and selection depending on the time of year.

STEAM Night

- ★ Promoting cross-curriculum deep learning.
- ★ A collaboration between teachers and the Learning Commons to bring a fun evening of Science, Tech, Engineering, Art, and Math to grade 7 & 8 students.
- ★ Night ends with an engineering challenge in the Learning Commons run by the Library Technician.
- ★ Activities include catapult building, boat making, computer programming, fruit DNA, mystery boxes, UV art and more.

Low-Tech Makerspace Collaboration

- ★ Challenge students in groups to work together to connect their creations/activities to a read-aloud or a unit being taught in class or simply let students create freestyle.
- ★ Create stations with different materials/activities for students to rotate through.
- ★ Promotes creativity, collaboration and making connections with what students read.
