# What Happened?

In 2019, Vancouver Public Library and Toronto Public Library rented space to organizations providing a platform for author Megan Murphy.

# Why is this a big deal?

Many people within the LGBTQ2+ community believe that allowing Megan Murphy to speak in a public library provides defacto support for her transphobic beliefs and causes marginalized/vulnerable populations to feel unsafe in these spaces.

- "We made it clear that this was a choice between years and years that staff, community members and organizations like Glad Day have invested versus a few hours with a hateful speaker from another city. They didn't choose us. The leadership of the TPL does not value our voice, our investment or our relationship."
